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CHAPERONE CODE-OF CONDUCT

1. NO drugs or alcohol consumption.
2. Chaperones will conduct themselves as a role model.
3. Chaperones **are not** to visit the hotel lounge for any reason.
4. If you smoke, please be as discreet as possible.

*We have students in the choir who are smokers, which is in violation of their policy agreement. Do not let your smoking habit cause them to be falsely accused because of your smoking getting on their clothing. **Absolutely no smoking in the hotel rooms!***

5. Remain positive with the students!
6. Work as a team. Offer assistance to other chaperones!
7. Learn to monitor student behavior without smothering them. You do not have to be a dictator; This should be a positive and rewarding experience for each student.
8. Please do not make deals or special favors with students. Special favors cause many problems either during the tour or when we return home.
9. You are the information center for your D.C. kids. Make sure you understand the daily itinerary. In addition, you are responsible to be aware of any changes in our schedule and get the information to the students.
10. All Marysville code-of-conduct and tour guidelines will also apply to chaperones.
11. Please dress appropriately. If it is not allowed in the student's dress code, it is also inappropriate for the chaperones to wear.
12. You are the information source for Mr. Martin. Don't be afraid to inform Mr. Martin of any important information. It is crucial that you use your intuition, (i.e., conduct violation, illnesses, etc.) This is our job and we are responsible for **all final** decisions and safety of the students.
13. **STAY POSITIVE! :0) The days can get long, and we stay very busy. Please stay positive in front of the kids, and mind what you post on Facebook and social media. It can be our best friend, or our worst enemy.**

NEW YORK STUDENTS

1. You will be assigned no more than 6 students.
2. You will be asked to provide information to your children to help them have a successful trip.
3. You will be asked to assist in observing and guiding your group to adhere to all school policies and tour policies.
4. Prior to leaving Marysville, it is crucial for you to understand the Marysville extracurricular code of conduct.
5. School dress code will be strictly monitored. ***Any student dressed inappropriately should be instructed to change prior to leaving the hotel for the day.***

CHAPERONE MEETINGS

1. There will be daily Chaperone meetings in a designated area for all chaperones.
2. All meetings are mandatory.
3. Be flexible! There will be constant changes and/or additions to the schedule.
4. Please pay attention to the bus supervisors. They are receiving information from either Paula (our tour guide), Mr. Martin. Please do not question their authority.
5. Please bring your procedures manual and itinerary with you to all meetings. In addition, you will need something to take notes with.

LUGGAGE INSPECTION

Procedures:

1. Student must be present with their luggage
2. Chaperones will conduct the inspection.

The following items are not allowed: DVD players, DVD's, Laptops, movies, decorations, glass thermos, homemade baked goods, inappropriate literature, any substance that violates Marysville code-of-conduct.

3. Once the luggage has been inspected and marked with tape, it cannot be reopened. The student will leave their luggage in gender-appropriate dressing room.

We will need to have a couple of chaperones to monitor the doors into and out of the dressing room and backstage hallway area. Absolutely no more than ONE luggage item per student.

Once the luggage inspection is complete, the dressing rooms will be off limits. The dressing rooms will remain locked and quarantined until the busses are loaded Friday morning.

CARRY-ON INSPECTION

Inspection will begin promptly at 3:45 p.m.

When the busses arrive, there will be two tables set-up in the hallway.

All chaperones will load their luggage and carry-on items before the boarding procedures begin.

I will need each chaperone to inspect the students' carry-on luggage. **You will inspect** the carry-on items for the bus to which you are assigned, and have students empty their pockets.

Each bus should have the following assignments:

- 2 chaperones inspecting carry-on items
- 2 chaperones loading large luggage from the dressing room
- 2 chaperones guarding the door of each bus

Once the student has completed the carry-on inspection, they must proceed directly onto the bus. If they do not, then they must return to the inspection line for a second inspection.

Most importantly, once the student enters the bus, they are not to get off the bus for any reason.

If an item is not listed above, it is NOT allowed on the trip!

In order meet our deadline and departure time, it is crucial that all chaperones be at the school at 3:00 p.m. We will try and have our loading finalized prior to the students arriving at 3:30 p.m. If we leave late from Marysville, it will cause a domino effect for all of our other scheduled events for the day.

BUS TRIP TO AND FROM N.Y.C.

TRINITY BUSES (734-284- 8229 / 313-295- 6303)

1. Unify the bus rules. Be consistent throughout the trip.
2. Assigned seating must remain throughout the trip. (Both directions.) Students can switch seats during the time we are en route. HOWEVER, they must be back in their assigned seat after every stop.
3. NO sleeping on the floor of the bus.
4. Watch for couples. No “purpling.” OVER-NIGHT BUS RIDE – BOY/BOY, GIRL/GIRL; No Exceptions. Lights out at 11:00 p.m. – 6:00 a.m.
5. ATTENDANCE – Must be taken after every stop! Even bathroom breaks. We will use the bus seating charts to take attendance.
6. Let students have fun without abusing other student’s privacy or at the expense of their safety.
7. Keep the bus clean...periodically, have a “clean-up” time and walk through the bus. Keep a trash bag available and clean out the bus at each stop.
8. Restroom – please limit the use of bus restrooms except in extreme emergencies. Establish rules that will safeguard the use of the restroom. By the time we arrive at our destination, the restrooms are producing a strong odor, which is difficult for those who get the last seat on the bus.
9. Food/snacks – prepackaged food only – no homemade goods.
10. MOVIES – assigned movies only. NO EXCEPTIONS. Keep the rules and policies consistent between both busses.
11. Determine movie hours. If a movie is playing, then everyone should show respect. There isn’t a headphone system on the bus.

BUS SUPERVISORS

You are the information center for the entire bus – ALL announcements will be read by the bus supervisor!

1. Attendance! Every time the bus stops for food, fuel, or an event, attendance MUST be taken. We cannot be too careful. You must take attendance before the bus can continue on its way. Both buses **must** verify attendance before leaving.
2. You must see that the behavior rules remain consistent throughout both buses. Please do not make exceptions.
3. Bus supervisors have the responsibility of the DVD and movies. Under no circumstances will there be a substitution of a movie. The bus supervisor will have the list of movies.
4. The students are not allowed to have stereos, or portable DVD players, We are allowing tablet devices and Chromebooks– **PLEASE MIND THE MATERIAL ON THESE DEVICES**. If there is anything obscene or inappropriate, you must take the device from the student.
5. Make sure you communicate to the bus when food stops will occur. Most of the bus drivers will have a good idea of where there are multiple restaurants. They should be open to any suggestions to the bus supervisor. You have the capability of understanding the students and their needs. You, as the bus supervisor, will need to understand their destination and driving times.
6. Make sure you communicate with the other bus supervisor. Generally speaking, the goal would be to have the buses park in a central location and have the students select their desired restaurant.

FOOD STOPS

1. ALL CHAPERONES will be responsible to watch the students during mealtime. Behavior in public restaurants, hotel dining room, or while in New York. is very important.
2. If you see inappropriate behavior, please assist with the management of the students and correct the situation.
3. You need to watch that all students are eating every meal.
4. It is important that we move the students through the lines as quickly as possible.
5. While en route, make sure students purchase food that will sustain them during the trip and through our performances.
6. All breakfasts will be served at the hotel. Each chaperone has the responsibility of seeing that ***all*** of their students attend the breakfast and actually eat! Because we have a rigorous agenda, it's imperative the students get a healthy start to their day.

HOTEL POLICIES

HILTON NEWARK AIRPORT
1170 Spring St., Elizabeth, NJ 07201 (908-351- 3900)

1. The number one rule is **no one is allowed to leave the hotel at any time.** We will always leave the hotel or any event as a group. Requests for jogging or exercising outside the hotel grounds or facility are prohibited.
2. The use of the hotel pool will only be available when an adult from Marysville can be at the pool to supervise. Please use caution and common sense when using the pool. Please make sure students leave plenty of time to get ready for room check and lights out.
3. Students must use the buddy system at the hotel. If students want to visit the lobby area and the snack bars, they must travel in pairs. If you allow a student to go to the lobby after hours, then a chaperone must be with them.
4. Chaperones should be highly visible and assist in any way. This is not the time to hide-out in your hotel room. Your presence may prevent any problems that the students might be plotting.
5. Outside telephone calls will be turned off in the rooms. In addition, pay T.V. will not be allowed in any of the rooms. If refrigerators are in the rooms, they are to remain locked for the entire trip.
6. Male/Female visiting in the rooms is strictly prohibited. At no time is a member of the opposite sex allowed to enter a hotel room. They must use the hallway, outside lounge areas, or the hotel lobby to meet.
7. At curfew time, which is established on a daily basis, all students must be in their assigned room and are not to leave for any reason. Permission will be granted only for emergencies. Students should contact their chaperone by cell phone.
8. All chaperones must do a physical room check at curfew. This means physically enter the room and investigate. **DO NOT BE SHY! BE INQUISITIVE!** Your final bed check should be your final visit to the room. Make yourself visible in the hallways. However, try to keep your noise to a minimum. Do not knock on the doors unless there is a lot of noise coming from the room. With the little amount of time actually spent in the hotel, most students come back a crash willingly!
9. Marysville has maintained a positive reputation when visiting hotels. Now is not the time to change this. With hotels becoming more concerned by the impact of student groups on other hotel guests, it is harder to find hotels to accommodate large groups. Our tour company, "Educational Tours, Inc.," has worked hard to establish a positive relationship with this hotel. **TEAM WORK!**

HOTEL GUESTS

1. All parents and families that have chosen to stay at the same hotel must respect and abide by the policies that have been established for this tour.
2. Under no circumstances will a child leave with their family prior to the conclusion of our tour, which is Sunday morning at 10:00 a.m. EST.
3. If a parent wants to visit a child, they can visit in the hotel lobby or the well-lit outdoors seating area.
4. We have had parents who bring alcohol with them on vacation! As a safeguard to the Marysville code-of-conduct, no student will visit their parent's room.
5. Do not let outside parents interfere with the demanding job that you so graciously volunteered to do. They had an opportunity to chaperone as well and chose not to. If you have any challenging situations, please advise Mr. Martin or Mr. Smith and they will handle the situation.
6. At no time can a visiting parent alter the itinerary. Example, taking their child to the convenience store for supplies. If a parent or child says their parents have something they have purchased for their child, it must be approved and cleared by the student's chaperone or Mr. Martin. Believe it or not, it is not uncommon for a parent to supply illegal substances/cigarettes to a student while on a field trip or at the hotel. Most of the time, the student does not supply the substances; rather, outside sources have usually been at the center of the problem.

MEDICAL ATTENTION

1. Medical forms will be distributed and organized for each bus.
2. NO chaperone will be allowed to administer any prescription drug or over the counter medicine. Even if it is aspirin or Tylenol, it will be the responsibility of a designated chaperone. IF the parent of the student is a chaperone, permission of medication distribution is obviously permissible.
3. If a student becomes sick while on the bus, please use a cell phone and call one of the designated chaperones before making any medical decision and/or distributing medication.
4. Watch the students and observe their behavior.
5. Handling of blood – if a student has an exposed wound or excessive bleeding, the use of medical gloves is required. The clean-up procedure of blood or other bodily fluids requires the use of surgical gloves.
6. If a student is injured and requires medical attention, Mr. Martin or Ms. Holth MUST be notified.
7. If a student requires advanced medical attention, the parent of the student MUST be notified.
8. No child left behind! NO student left behind!
9. Meals – sometimes a student's illness is from a lack of food and/or water (dehydration)

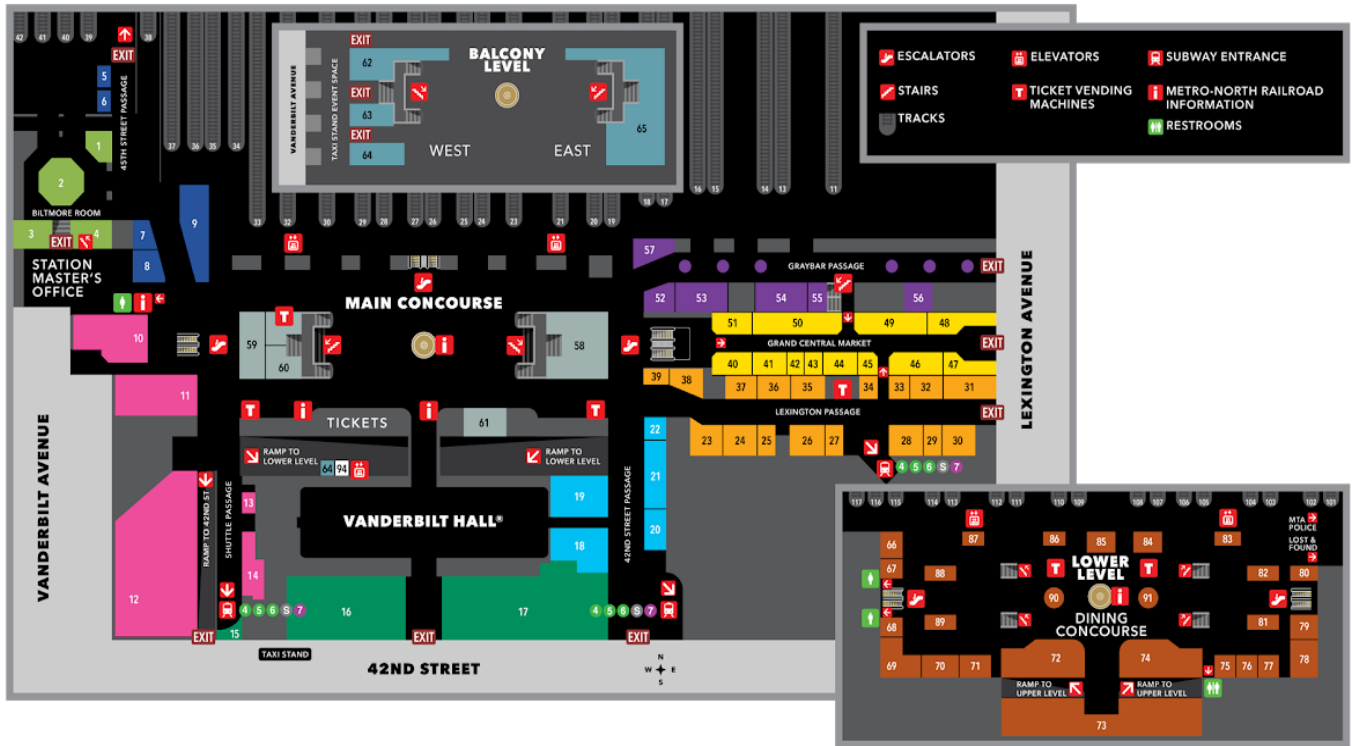
